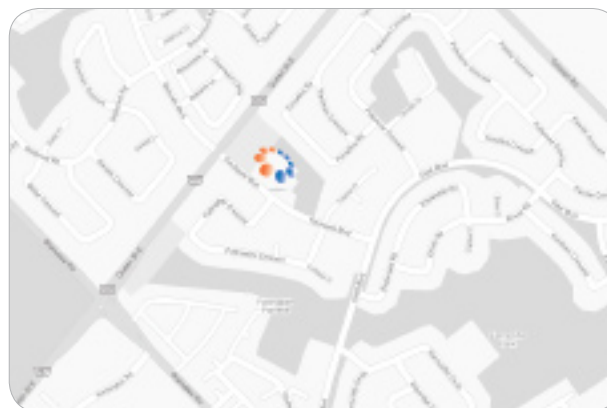

### **IMPORTANCE OF ORAL HEALTH**
